

## Like father like son... it's all in the DNA

**B**ubba Shoberl is a name everyone in the American Motorcycle Association (AMA) knows and knows well. He won three consecutive AMA Grand National dirt track championships (1985-87) and went on to take the AMA Superbike championship in 1988. His racing career ended after an accident at the 1989 USGP at Laguna Seca. He hasn't left racing behind though. He's coaching his son Clint to AMA victory.

Seventeen-year-old Clint started riding when he was three years old and hasn't slowed down since. He won the Amateur

Heavyweight SuperBike, the Amateur Middleweight SuperSport and the Amateur Heavyweight SuperSport classes and took home the AMA Sports Top Rookie Award in 2008. His eyes are on next year's Horizon Award.

Clint's plan for the 2009 season includes racing all of the QRA events, all the AMA amateur national events, and as many WERA events as possible. He's moved up to the expert/pro ranks, and his goal is to be the best amateur expert by the end of 2009 and move on to higher rankings.

Focus, momentum, and patience are the strengths Clint relies on to win races. "And my dad is the best possible coach," he said.

Clint rode off-road until he was 15 when he was introduced to dirt-track racing and did a few races. Dirt-track racing proved his interest in road racing, so he got his first CBR 600rr in April 2008. His first race was in May and he was hooked. He had huge achievements this year, including winning his first road race in Hallet, OK, scoring the hat trick at MSR Cresson, winning three national championships, and winning the 2008 Top Rookie Award.
